

Director's Note

When my nervous, innocent second-year self initially proposed *Twelfth Night* as a mainstage production in Fall 2019, there was no way I could have anticipated the evolution this project would undergo over the next year. My initial proposal aimed to mimic the aesthetics of 1950s advertisements in order to highlight the strict heteronormativity and gender roles that the characters of Shakespeare's play challenge and break. This plan leaned heavily into the visual: a multi-leveled stage, which I drew on the blackboard at the beginning of every rehearsal; brightly colored costumes, lights, and backdrops; and extensive physical comedy and blocking.

In March, when the pandemic threatened to cancel this production altogether, something in me refused to let go of the project until the cast, the crew, and I had something to show for all the work we had done. After realizing there was no version of *Twelfth Night* that could be done safely as a mainstage production, I reluctantly parted with the visual elements of the play. Thus, the radio play version was born, and the show took on a completely new life that — dare I say — I might like even more than my initial mainstage concept. We were still able to maintain a sense of 1950s advertisements, incorporating cheesy sound effects, fun musical interludes, and narrations modeled after the radio and television sitcoms of the mid-twentieth century. Trust the process, as the kids say.

I could not have finished this project without the practical and emotional support of Stage Manager Charlie Mooz and Assistant Director Tanaka Muvavarirwa. These two were by my side from the beginning, before we even had a full artistic staff or cast. They helped me phrase my notes in a way that made sense outside of my head, they called me out when I fixated too much on specific details (ahem, the blocking of Toby and Maria's exit in 4.2), and most importantly, they kept me sane.

This production now symbolizes the resilience of the arts even in the most difficult of times. My lovely team provided me with a sense of community and purpose despite our isolation, and I hope I have provided the same to them. Many cast and crew members have been involved at various points throughout the process, and each and every one of them brought new and exciting ideas that influenced this play's final iteration. I could not be prouder of the work we have done, and even though it hurts to say goodbye to a project that has been a huge part of my collegiate life, it is my honor to present to you *Twelfth Night: The Radio Show!*
